MOTIVATION OF WOMEN DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE FOR PARTICIPATION IN WOMEN DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES IN SARAPEE DISTRICT, CHIANGMAI PROVINCE

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This study was conducted with the following objectives: 1) to determine the personal and socio-economic characteristics of the women development committee in Sarapee district, Chiang Mai province; 2) to study the types of motivation for their participation in women development activities; and, 3) to test the differences of the various types of this motivation based on their different personality and socio-economic characteristics. Data respondents for this study consisted of 204 non-randomized members of the Sarapee women development committee. Data collection was done through the use of pre-tested questionnaires and conducted from April to June 2001. Data was later analyzed using the computer software packaged program for the social science research.

Results of the study showed that data respondents were 46 years on the average age. Most of them had only reached the early primary school levels. They had an average annual income of 143,739 baht and they had an average of 2 household labors for income generation while their

household consisted of 4 members. All respondents had training experience at an average of five times and had contacts with the community development officer a year an average of 4 time a year.

According the different types of motivation for participation in women development activities (before, during, and after the period of being a women development committee), the results of the study showed that the pay they earned tended to be the highest motivating factor. There were also the materialistic motivation. The other motivations were reputation, achievement and social relationship respectively.

The testing of differences in the various types of motivation for participation in women development activities, was mainly based on the differences in the personality and socio-economic characteristics of the data respondents. The results of the study showed that differences in their household income was the motivation to participate in women development activities. Meanwhile the differences in age, education, number of household members, household labor, training experience income and the frequency of contacting the community development officer did not affect to their motivation.
